## The Principal's Corner

It's not too early to be thinking about the 2016-17 school year. We have opened up registration for preschool through 8<sup>th</sup> grade students. Our preschool is filling up fast! If you need a 2016-17 registration form, please contact the school office or download one off our website. If you have been thinking of sending your children to St. Mary's School and didn't think you could afford this in your family budget, please know that scholarship money is available. You will need to complete some financial paperwork that is mailed to an independent company, PSAS, to be processed and evaluated for need. Our St. Mary's School families were awarded over \$85,000 in scholarships this school year between the Bishop's Scholarships and our own St. Mary's Scholarships from the Tri-Cities Unity Auction and golf outings. The Bishop is also offering the "Welcome Scholarship" to new families that attend a Catholic Parish, but haven't attended a Catholic School in the Diocese of Grand Rapids. Preschool students get \$250 and K-8<sup>th</sup> grade students get \$750 for their first year.

Please continue to pray for the Mary, Seat of Wisdom Campaign. We are excited to break ground on the new addition after Mass with Bishop Walkowiak at 9:00 AM on Friday, March 18<sup>th</sup>. We welcome all parishioners and Mary, Seat of Wisdom donors to join us for Mass and the Ground Breaking ceremony along with a brunch afterwards. We plan to be using this new educational center/school in the fall of 2016.

## A Word From The Pastor

As we begin this last week before Holy Week there is so much to get excited about! On Friday Bishop Walkowiak will join us to celebrate 9 am Mass and then we will break ground on our new building that will house our school and faith formation classes. This has been in the long-term planning for over a decade, and we have been raising money for almost 2 ½ years. There have been small signs of progress as we have taken down the old rectory, removed some trees, and done some site work, but now things are really moving forward. I am truly amazed and humbled by all of the support that this project has received from so many different people, and it makes me so proud to be the pastor of St. Mary in Spring Lake. A huge thank you to everyone who has prayed and given of their time and/or their money to make this day a reality. When we come together as the Body of Christ we can do amazing things under the direction of the Holy Spirit.

I wanted to give all of you an update as to where the project currently stands. We have come to the realization that our original goal to have the building done in time for the start of the upcoming school year was just too ambitious. However, we are going to be pushing things forward so that we can move the students in either around Thanksgiving or Christmas break this year, with a formal dedication around the first week of December. In order to accommodate this schedule, the day after Easter a large temporary fence will go up around the southeast end of the property. This will obviously greatly reduce the amount of parking available to us, but we are also looking at doing some of the paving of the current green space in April to give us more places to park during the construction. We will do our best to make sure there is as little disruption as possible, but the door to the southeast corner of the building (by the kitchen/pantry) will be inaccessible beginning the day after Easter. The construction on the new building should be substantially completed by early November, and then we will begin work on the elementary building to convert it to our new pantry and storage building.

We have also received some bad news as part of the planning process. In order to meet fire code, we must install fire sprinklers in our church sanctuary and basement (unless we can get a waiver, so please pray hard for that). Since this will involve moving all of the pews, this would be a great time to also install the new tile and carpeting that had been planned before I arrived. Our hope is that this work will take place during the month of July. The church will still be usable on weekends, but probably not on weekdays. In addition, the cost of this side project could run over \$350,000. This is obviously a huge unexpected expense, but one which will benefit everyone in the parish greatly. As we work to finance the payoff of the new education center, we will also be working with our generous donors to figure out how to pay for all of these additional expenses. For right now, however, we could just use everyone's prayers that we can get a waiver for the fire code!

May God bless all of you during this upcoming week and may these remaining days of Lent be a time of great spiritual growth! Mary, Seat of Wisdom, pray for us!!!
